

Projects funded by the Youth in Action Granting Program, 2019

Canadian Bhutanese Society

Project: Youth recreation, \$2,000

To connect newcomers to Canada with opportunities to socialize with others through sports.

Cardston Junior High School

Project: Bat and bird boxes, \$2,000: To build shelter boxes for bats and mountain bluebirds, encouraging habitat establishment for species that are important to the biodiversity of Southwestern Alberta.

Carmangay & District Municipal Library

Project: Library technology project, \$600

To purchase a tablet for use by library patrons.

Coalhurst High School

Project: Coalhurst High School STEM Club, \$1,600

For the establishment of a STEM Club, offering students opportunities to explore topics in science, technology, engineering, and math beyond the existing curricula.

Kainai Basketball Association

Project: Youth basketball program, \$2,000

To purchase basketball gear and equipment for the newly-established basketball league, reducing barriers for participants.

The MAT Youth Centre, Lethbridge

Project: Hygiene kits, \$600

To educate youth about the importance of self-care and good hygiene. The grant provides two years of funding for hygiene kit supplies, including toothpaste, toothbrushes, and deodorant.

Town of Coaldale

Project: Dog park, \$2,000

To purchase training and agility equipment for the town's dog park.

Victoria Park High School Interact Club, Lethbridge

Project: Blanket ceremony, \$1,000

To promote Reconciliation by holding an official Blanket Ceremony, led by a member of Lethbridge's Indigenous community.
