



Community Priorities Fund Grant Recipients - Spring 2021

Claresholm & District Health Foundation, \$15,000:

To upgrade X-Ray diagnostic imaging technology at the Claresholm Hospital, making images instantly available for both local physicians and specialists.

Elim Society for Senior Citizen's Care, \$15,000:

To replace the roof on the Balmoral House, an affordable housing facility for seniors in Lethbridge.

Foothills Alcohol Action Society, \$8,800:

To replace detox beds and provide bedside dressers for all clients.

Fort Macleod Historical Association, \$15,000

To repair the roof of the Blackfoot Gallery building at the Fort Museum.

Fresh Start Recovery Centre - South Country (Lethbridge County), \$15,000:

To purchase a new transportation vehicle to transport clients in recovery.

Historical Society of Alberta - Lethbridge Historical Society, \$3,500:

To purchase computers and video equipment to keep members and the public connected to local and provincial history.

Horizon School Division – Vauxhall Elementary School, \$5,000:

To develop a new multi-sensory room.

Horizon School Division – Chamberlain School (Grassy Lake), \$5,300:

For the development of an outdoor sitting area that will be used by Chamberlain School and the Grassy Lake Community Library.

Lethbridge Food Bank Society, \$15,000:

To purchase new shelving and storage for the expansion of the warehouse.

Lethbridge Senior Citizens Organization, \$5,400:

For equipment to upgrade the wireless internet, so that the internet connection reaches all corners of the facility.

Link Pathway Committee (Coaldale), \$12,000:

For the construction of a 15 kilometre paved pathway that will link the communities of Lethbridge and Coaldale through Lethbridge County.

Milk River Municipal Library, \$2,000:

To renovate the building for water access in the library.

Municipality of Crowsnest Pass – Pass Powderkeg Ski Society, \$15,000:

To purchase a washroom trailer for public use at Pass Powderkeg Ski Area in the winter and the adjoining hiking and mountain bike trails in the summer.



Nanton Lancaster Society, \$8,900:

To fill in the cracks in the hangar floor at the Bomber Command museum to improve the safety of the museum and slow the deterioration of the concrete floor.

Opokaa'sin Early Intervention Society, \$10,000:

To purchase and install a metal panel fencing that will increase the safety and security of the facility.

Palliser School Division – Huntsville School (Iron Springs), \$5,000:

To develop a multi-sensory room.

Palliser School Division – Dorothy Dalgliesh School (Picture Butte), \$10,000:

To purchase outdoor classroom equipment so that students can engage in open-air learning and instruction.

Palliser School Division – Coalhurst High School, \$10,000:

For the purchase of concrete tables and seating for an outdoor classroom and community gathering space.

Pincher Creek Community Hall Society, \$15,000:

To purchase and install new flooring that will replace 1972 tile flooring on the dance floor.

Prairie Winds Clubhouse Society (Claresholm), \$15,000:

To develop an outdoor backyard space that will be safe for social gathering.

Ranchlands Victim Services Society, \$6,500:

To purchase new furniture that will provide a comfortable safe and relaxing environment for victims of crime.

Town of Fort Macleod - Senior Citizens Welcome Mat Fort Macleod \$5,540:

To replace the 20-year-old furniture at the Seniors Welcome Mat.

Town of Nanton – Nanton & District Leo Club, \$5,000:

To construct a fence on the one-acre dog park in the Town of Nanton.

Town of Raymond - Raymond Seniors Centre \$6,000:

To install new audiovisual equipment, including a projector and speaker system.

Village of Barnwell, \$10,000:

To resurface existing pickle ball courts with rubberized sport court surface to improve the quality of play and expand the use of the facility.

Village of Stirling – Stirling Lions Club, \$12,000:

To replace the existing bathroom in the west recreation area with a new, accessible facility.

Village of Warner – Warner Revitalization Committee, \$7,500:

To construct a community garden and planters in public areas in the village.

Vulcan County – Milo and District Fire Association, \$7,500:

To purchase a Remotely Operated Underwater Vehicle (ROV) to aid in the recovery of drowning victims and/or property.

To purchase outdoor classroom equipment so that students can engage in open-air learning and instruction.

Westwind School Division – Mountain View School, \$15,000:
