Community Priorities Grant Recipients, Fall 2021

5th on 5th Youth Services, Lethbridge, \$15,000 (\$3,500 from the LADA): For repairs and upgrades to 5th on 5th's roof, HVAC unit, and windows.

Cardston Elementary School, \$10,000: To refurbish the school's playground.

Cardston Junior High School, \$7,500: To purchase instruments for the school band program.

Carmangay & District Municipal Library, \$5,000: To replace the building's HVAC unit.

Claresholm Skatepark Association, \$15,000 (\$8,400 from a Field of Interest Fund): To build an outdoor concrete skatepark.

Dr. Gerald B. Probe Elementary School, Lethbridge, \$10,000 (\$1,500 from the LADA): To support construction of an accessible school playground.

Fort Macleod Health Care Auxiliary Association, \$15,000 (\$4,500 from a Field of Interest Fund): To add a patio with a gazebo to the Health Centre's Care Bed Unit, giving patients, visitors, and staff a clean and comfortable gathering space.

Gem of the West Museum, Coaldale, \$8,400 (\$1,500 from the LADA): This grant supports the redevelopment of the museum's Indigenous exhibit.

Get-A-Way Youth Centre, Vulcan, \$15,000: To renovate the facility's kitchen.

Good Samaritan Society, Lethbridge, \$15,000 (\$1,500 from the LADA): To replace furniture in the common room at Park Meadows Village.

Horace Allen School, Coleman, \$10,000: To provide trees, plants, composting supplies, and other equipment for the school's outdoor learning environment.

Kainai Food Bank Society, \$5,000 (\$1,500 from the LADA): To purchase appliances and other equipment for the kitchen.

Kootenai Brown Pioneer Village, Pincher Creek, \$10,700: To renovate an existing building in order to provide concession services.

Lethbridge Corridor Victim Services Unit, \$7,500: To purchase furnishings for its new offices in Coaldale, as well as to provide audiovisual equipment to assist clients interacting with the justice system.

McNally Community Association and Southern Accord Chorus Society, \$3,700: To upgrade information technology and internet access for groups that use the McNally Community Hall.

Milk River Community School Enhancement Society, \$12,500: To support the expansion and community gathering enhancement of the school gymnasium.

Piikani Food Bank, \$15,000 (\$400 from a Field of Interest Fund): For outdoor improvements, including a gazebo.

Raymond Junior High School, \$7,500: To purchase instruments for the school band program.

Royal Canadian Legion, General Stewart Branch No. 4, Lethbridge, \$15,000: For facility renovations, including bar and concession area improvements, and for repairs to the RCAF jet's display pedestal.

St. Michael's School, Pincher Creek, \$10,000: For completion of phase one of a project to build a regulation size basketball court at the school.

Stavely & District Agricultural Society, \$10,000: For renovations and upgrades to the Stavely Community Arena.

Stavely Municipal Library, \$6,500: For information technology upgrades to accommodate the Chinook Arch Regional Library System's transition to Supernet 2.0.

Taber Central Elementary School, \$3,500: To purchase ukuleles for the school's music programs.

Town of Coaldale, \$15,000 (\$1,500 from the LADA): This grant supports the construction of the community's new recreation centre.

Town of Fort Macleod, \$6,500 (\$1,500 from the LADA): To add outdoor lockers and a water wheelchair to the swimming pool facility.

YouthONE and NineBar Foundation, Lethbridge, \$15,000 (\$2,500 from the LADA): To purchase equipment and defray startup costs for a new indoor skateboard program located in downtown Lethbridge.

Henry S. Varley Fund for Rural Life Grant Recipients, Fall 2021

Careers: The Next Generation, \$7,500: This grant will support the development of partnerships with off-campus education programs to connect students to employers in the agricultural sector for paid integrated learning internships.

Lethbridge Therapeutic Riding Association, \$30,000 (\$2,000 from the LADA): To expand on-location equine therapy programs to seniors' homes, medical facilities, addictions treatment centres, and youth transitional housing in rural communities throughout Southwestern Alberta.

Ranchlands Victim Services Society, \$5,000 (\$700 from a Field of Interest Fund): To facilitate training for new staff, with a focus on tools and methods for helping clients in rural communities.

Safe Haven Women's Shelter Society, \$30,000: To develop on-site life skills programming for women transitioning from the shelter back into independent life in the community.

Southwest Alberta Sustainable Communities Initiative and Adaptable Outdoors, \$21,400: To increase the capacity and reach of adaptive fishing programs that are geared toward those with disabilities and those in assisted care facilities.

Taber & District Museum Society, \$3,400: To support rental and training fees for specialized digitization equipment to scan and digitally archive its collection of local newspaper microfilm.
